




Dragonslayer (1981)



<u>Pastor Salary</u> (Rated: 4 of 5 Acorns) <u>www.my-pastor.com</u>

Developing an adequate pastor salary package is a challenge for every local church. But a little planning can make the clergy compensation process much less painful


An interesting article on considering the cost of a minister's salary, often the largest aspect of a church's budget. Most Druid groves I know have under 10 members, so supporting a full-time priest is out of the question for many groves, even a part-time share or "circuit druid" program. ADF has come the closest, but have few full-paid staff/priests (if any). Many ministers/priest need "a day job" of course.



The Story of Halloween by Carol Greene (Rated: 5 of 5 Acorns)

A good run through of the various layers of the holiday for ages 3 to 12. Talks about variants with Druids, Romans (Pomona), early Christian, English, Irish feast items of the season, the famine bringing them to america, the shift from turnips to pumpkins for jack o lanterns and the story of Jack, American expansion of costuming, the recent shift from house visits to organized parties, UNICEF boxes, party games and a few very ideas and spooky riddles.

When Dinosaurs Die: A Guide to Understanding Death (Dino Life Guides for Families) (Rated 5 of 5 Acorns)

The authors explain in simple language the feelings people may have regarding the death of a loved one and the ways to honor the memory of someone who has died.

Marc Brown, the author, is well known for the "Arthur" PBS series of an aardvark who likes to read. This is simply an amazing book that exceeded my expectations. It wasn't so much a story of one particuliar person (good for ages 3-8) but a conversation-provoker book of 26 illustrated pages that approached death from many angles. More in comment section.



Raising Witches (Rated: 5 of 5 Acorns)

This is the first book (2002) that gives parents the means to teach their children Wicca in a more formal fashion. Featuring a Wiccan curriculum for each of the five age groups from infancy to young adulthood, O'Gaea shows parents how to effectively weave Wicca into a child's natural progression of ...

I have a 2 & 4 year old, and I am reading through available books on nature-centered child-rearing, which tend to be Wicca-oriented (not that I care too much), and also working on the 1995 classic by Ceisir Smith, "The Pagan Family" which I also like. "Raising Witches"

is smooth and well-transitioned, based on their raising a child in Arizona for 18 years, some theory, some counseling, lots of ideas.

A Druid Pilgrimage to Carleton College



If you are part of the <u>Reformed Druids of North America</u> (RDNA), and/or any of its offshoots and related branches, you're probably aware that "The Reform" started in a small college in Minnesota in the 60's. Back in 1963, students at Carleton College in

Northfield, Minnesota started the Reformed Druid movement as a protest against forced attendance at religious services by the college. What started as a simple protest grew many legs, and now there are thousands of Reformed Druids, Groves, Proto-groves, and related organizations.

The moral here – be careful when organizing a simple protest!

I traveled to Carleton College last week to do a solitary mini-pilgrimage to a few of the Druid sites where it all began. You can see photos on my Flickr site from my visit here. Incidentally, if you've followed my blog, you know that I used to live in Northfield, Minnesota for a time before I began this journey into Druidry. There is a more formal Full Pilgrimage that was published in The Druid Inquirer recently. While I only did a portion of the pilgrimage, it's worth the read as it gives some good background into the places I visited! Many thanks goes out to all of the Carleton Druids for starting quite a movement!



Come sit by my hearth, and share with me, the burden in life that afflicts thee.


Come sit by my hearth, the embers dance, your darkest worries float through the trance.






DESPERATE DRUIDS

If you haven't seen the animated series, go back and take a new look. The first 7 of a projected 40 episodes are done, about 92 minutes total. Another 3 are coming out before Samhain.

Started June 2011. I made 6 Episodes by July as a stand-alone series of lectures. Then I went back and recast them in the style of a dramatic webseries that has the following goals:

- Provide a glimpse of how groves operate and deal with festivals, recruiting, training and orientation.
- Put a human face on the many variants of Reformed Druids.
- Follow a new Reformed Druid through a cycle of the year, with developments linked to the season.
- Share the history, customs and stories of Reformed Druidism.
- Give a sense of the humor, timing, and interaction that makes Reformed Druidism special.
- Have an entertaining, intertwined series of sub-plots and story arcs.



Desperate Druids: Part 0 Introduction

At the request of a few confused viewers. This "pre-quel" introduces the cast, purpose, scope and aim of the overall series.

Desperate Druids: Part 1 - A Walk in the Woods

Peter meets the mysterious and lovely Sarah, asks her about Druidism, and gets the basics from her during a walk in the nearby forest.

Desperate Druids: Part 2 - The Two Basic Tenets

After the previous evening's introduction to the Druids, Peter goes to a coffee house with Sarah on a lazy Sunday afternoon to find out what beliefs bind the Druids together, and have a coffee.

Desperate Druids: Part 3 - Less is More





CRAFT CORNER

What is Art Clay Silver & what's in it?

When Art Clay Silver is taken out of the package, it is a slightly moist lump of clay (Image 1). The clay is composed of 1-20 micron sized silver particles, organic binders, and water. The clay is then molded into its desired generic shape, and dried. Once the clay is completely dry it can then be filed, carved, and sanded; after which it is fired with a gas stovetop, butane torch, or kiln.

During the firing process, the organic binders burn away and the resulting silver particles "sinter", becoming denser and stronger (Image 2). The burning away of binders and sintering of metal causes the piece to shrink 8-10% in overall size while retaining the original form. Once completely fired, the remaining piece is composed of 99.9% pure silver.

Examples of the three different firing methods:



What is the difference between Sterling Silver and Pure Silver?

Sterling Silver is composed of 92.5% silver and 7.5% of one or more other metals. A common misconception is that copper always makes up the remainder, when in reality titanium, platinum, palladium, and a list of other metals are often used. The addition of another metal to the silver creates an alloy. Sterling Silver is stronger than Pure Silver, and as an alloy, it tarnishes more quickly as well. Pure Silver is composed of 99.9% silver and nothing else.

Scientists Trace Heat Wave To Massive Star At Center Of Solar System

According to scientists, the large star could be described as a tremendous ball of energy.

PASADENA, CA—Groundbreaking new findings announced Monday suggest the record-

setting heat wave plaguing much of the United States may be due to radiation emitted from an enormous star located in the center of the solar system.

Scientists believe the star, which they have named G2V65, may in fact be the same bright yellow orb seen arcing over the sky day after day, and given its extreme heat and proximity to Earth, it is likely not only to have caused the heat wave, but to be responsible for every warm day in human history.

"Our measurements indicate the massive amount of energy this thing gives off is able to travel 93 million miles and reach our planet is as little as eight and a half minutes," said Professor Mitch Kivens, an astronomer at the California Institute of Technology. "While we can't see them, we're fairly certain these infrared rays strike Earth's surface, become trapped by the atmosphere, and just heat everything up like a great big oven."



"We originally thought that if this star was producing temperatures of 100-plus in the South and Midwest, it must be at least 100 degrees itself," Kivens added. "But it turns out it's far, far hotter than that, with a surface temperature of nearly 10,900 degrees Fahrenheit."

Kivens and his CalTech colleagues said this intense radiation, which results from constant nuclear reactions converting hydrogen to helium in the star's core, could also account for why the orb in the sky is extremely bright and difficult to stare at directly.

While scientists initially assumed the heat and luminescence of the star must make it the largest in the universe—a theory lent credence by the star appearing much bigger than other objects in the sky—they said the data actually appear to refute such a notion.

"Apparently it's gigantic simply because it's closer to us than any other star," Kivens said. "Which would also account for why we feel this particular star's heat during the day but are not warmed by the tiny blinking stars we see at night."

"It's interesting stuff," he added.

According to Kivens, the discovery has prompted researchers to explore the possibility that a variety of phenomena accompanying the heat wave could also be linked to the star, including taller grass, hot car seats, red skin burns, and sweating "even when one has just been standing there and hasn't been running around or anything."

An additional study is reportedly being conducted to determine if the unexplained shrinking of puddles until they disappear may be caused by star-hotness soaking up all the loose water. Moreover, scientists reportedly believe the heat emitted from the glowing orb could potentially be the reason why it is uncomfortable to walk on asphalt barefoot.

When asked if anything could be done to prevent or counteract the star's heat production, Kivens expressed skepticism.

"No, for the foreseeable future, I think we're locked into orbit with this thing," he said. "Although the star seems to disappear every night, 24-hour reports from around the world seem to indicate the star never leaves Earth entirely."


Residents of heat- and drought-stricken regions welcomed the findings, thankful to finally have an explanation for the high temperatures, if no relief from them.

"That makes sense, because it's usually hotter when that [star] is up in the air," said Stillwater, OK resident Asher Arps, 31, speaking to reporters as temperature rose to 110 degrees over the weekend. "I knew it lit things up, of course, but I didn't realize it could make things hot."

"The big star heats the earth, and the moon cools it—I get it," he added.

As to potential applications of the new discovery, experts acknowledge the possibilities could be limitless. "This is a watershed moment," renewable energy specialist Dr. Martin Flint said. "Who knows where this could lead? Perhaps we could develop a method of harnessing these big star rays and transforming them into some sort of ecologically friendly power source."

"Wait, what am I saying?" he said, laughing. "I'm getting ahead of myself. We still don't understand how it's possible for that thing to be up in the sky in January when it's freezing outside."



SUN IS SMILING!

Our sun is apparently a happy star, according to the latest video from a NASA observatory. The video shows a pattern of sunspots that, when viewed from afar, forms a vast happy face smiling across face of the sun.

<u>Sunspots are darker, cooler patches</u> on the sun caused when intense magnetic activity blocks

heat convection. These spots are normal, but they don't usually align to give the sun's face such character.

The smile on the sun is visible through 11 photographs taken by NASA's Solar Dynamics Observatory, which images the sun from Earth orbit. Each picture was taken at the same time, but through a different filter that separated out a narrow wavelength band of light. The images range from lowest temperature to highest.

These different temperatures correspond to different layers of the sun's atmosphere, starting with the sun's surface and gradually moving out to the sun's upper corona.

Divers find wooden sculpture of pagan deity at bottom of Drissa River in Rossony District in Belarus.

Prehistoric Irish Landscape Beneath Ocean

A RARE artefact that was tangled in seaweed attached to lobster pots may indicate the presence of a submerged prehistoric landscape off the north Connemara coast.

The flint core or scraper is "almost certainly" from a submerged site near Lettergesh, according to archaeologist Michael Gibbons.

"It is difficult to date precisely, but is likely to be 4,000 to 6,000 years old," Mr Gibbons says. The flint core, located in the lobster pot string by David Coyne, could have been used as a large scraper to clean hides or skin.

"The sea level rise on the Galway coast may have been by as much as 10 metres since the first people settled here almost 10,000 years ago, and this discovery suggests that this rare find is just the tip of the iceberg," Mr Gibbons says.

Several submerged landscapes have been located by archaeologists along the west coast. The remains of a midden site farther along the coast at Tullybeg were dated to between 6,000 and 7,000 years back by a team from Queen's University Belfast, he points out.

A flint arrowhead also recently located on Inishbofin off the Galway coast is the fifth such artefact to be associated with one area – the island's west quarter.

The arrowhead is early Bronze Age, which Mr Gibbons describes as "one of the finest ever to be found on Ireland's west coast, and is a classic museum piece".

"It was picked up by an American visitor while on a field trip to the island," he says. "The fact that it is one of five finds from this area suggests west quarter was an important hunting ground 4,500 years ago." The new addition also makes it the largest collection of arrowheads from one single location in Co Galway, Mr Gibbons notes.



"They were all located in an eroding bog, which may have been a fresh-water lagoon in later prehistory, attracting large amounts of fowl. A smaller arrowhead, black in colour, was found close by earlier in the summer."

The finds, he adds, are further proof of the "exceptionally rich" Bronze Age archaeology on the Connemara islands, including Inishbofin and Inishark, with many houses, field systems, cooking sites and enclosures identified there.

"People were drawn to the islands, perhaps for their rich deposits of soapstone and safe natural harbours." A separate recent discovery – a polished stone axe picked up in Joyce country near Connemara – yields "crucial evidence" of an early farming community living in the high mountain valley system overlooking the Mask and Corrib lakes, Mr Gibbons says.

"There are far fewer Neolithic sites in this area compared to north and west Connemara, but there are a number of spectacularly located hill-top tombs crowning the hills," Mr Gibbons says.

Taken together, the artefacts provide "further clues to Connemara's long and varied settlement history".
